- ► SLA with BSMHFT

- Supervision Structure

Successes so far as a pilot at the East Team... Project Perspective and Case Studies

- Well integrated into both employing organisations and BSMHFT team
- Involvement in wider perinatal service community engagements events
- Involved in facilitating groups, including Pregnancy & Beyond delivered in BWH and community, and MOMI group with Perinatal South Team
- Have a start date for our own perinatal peer support group Nurturing Minds: Wed 5th February 2020
- Quality Improvement project to improve services – reduce DNA and improve access
- Presented at several perinatal events
- BAME PSW trained in BFT

Initial Feeback (verbal)

- Family member expressed thanks for involvement and explained that having someone with lived experience talk to their daughter was reassuring
- Continuity of care and familiarity was greatly appreciated by service user

Challenges we faced...

The Challenges

- Difference in pre-employment checks timescales
- Experiences in all aspects of role have potential to trigger emotions from own personal experiences
- Engaging mums can be a challenge once referred
- Need to be prepared (and patient) for length of time it takes to convert an idea into reality

How we have addressed this/ what we could do differently?

- Delay start dates until all clearances have been authorised by NHS recruitment
- A supervision structure is in place to support PSW and the peers support each other. We had not considered the need for peer/peer support of each other and it is fortunate that all PSW get on and feel supported. May need to be more involved in recruitment process to ensure this occurs when employing again.
- Joint appointment with familiar practitioner prior to PSW contacting for 1-1 work

Aspirations so far as a pilot at the East Team...

- More of the same!!!
- Improving access to perinatal services from BAME communities
- Raise awareness of existing community services
- Reduce stigma and fears of services

- Continuity of care throughout Mum's recovery journey
- Facilitating a network of women who have previously used the service
- Challenge language barriers
- ► Tackle isolation
